
EYFS Spring I Knowledge Organiser: Into The Woods (Traditional Tales)

What are the ingredients of a good tale? This half term our focus will be on Traditional Tales. As the children engage in the range of stories we will use questioning to deepen their understanding of language, character, plot, sequence and setting, as well as studying the role of the author and the illustrator. The children will be drawing story maps; re-telling the stories through actions and key phrases; and composing their own stories to record in writing.




Modern tale	A tale that is new and has not been retold over many years.
Traditional tale	A tale that has been retold over many years.
Character	A person or an animal in a story
Hero/Heroine	The main character in a story. Is usually good and well liked.
Villain	The opposite character to a hero . The villain could be mean, nasty or evil.
Setting	Where the story is taking place.
Fiction	Stories that describe imaginary people and events

Children will learn:

- * How to be a good listener.
- * New vocabulary
- How to act out stories with their peers.
- * How to hold writing tools correctly to form letters.

Children will be able to:

- * Listen with attention, concentrate and sit quietly during appropriate activities.
- * Follow a story without pictures or props.
- * Use new vocabulary when talking.
- * Role play alongside others, using language to imagine and recreate roles.
- * Use a pencil and hold it effectively to form recognisable letters.
