








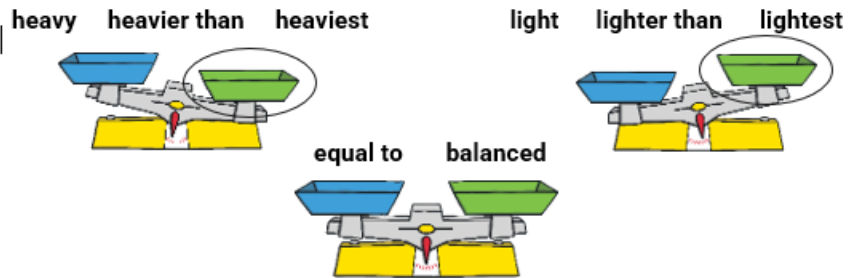

## Maths Talk and Learn: Supporting White Rose Maths Mass and Capacity

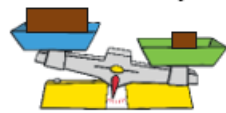
### Mass



Talk about what these balance scales show.



Bigger items are not always heavier. Smaller items are not always lighter.



Which item is the heaviest? Which is the lightest? How do you know? Put the items in order of lightest to heaviest.



### Challenge Yourself:

- Hold and compare the weight of different packages of items from around the house (e.g. cereal box, shoebox, bag of sugar). Which box feels the heaviest? Which box feels the lightest? Are bigger boxes always the heaviest?
- Make a boat out of some junk-modelling materials. Will it float in a sink of water? What happens when you add some passengers to the boat? Maybe your boat will sink. Why?

### Capacity



Talk about the size and shape of these containers.

Use some of these words: tall thin narrow wide shallow deep

Which container do you think might hold the most?



Compare the contents of each container.



Look at how many ladles it took to fill each container. Which container has the greatest capacity? Then, order them from smallest capacity to the greatest.



### Challenge Yourself:

- Select a cup. Count how many tablespoons it takes to fill your cup. Now, see how many teaspoons it takes. Which spoon was the quickest to fill the cup?
- Fill an empty jar with water. Then, find a container that holds more than your jar and another container that holds less than your jar. Empty the water from your jar into the containers to check.

- Sing the 'Five Little Ducks' song and use your fingers to show 1 fewer duck each time.

How many different ways can you make 5? This is exploring different compositions of this number.



Do you know the song 'Five Little Speckled Frogs'? How many frogs are in the pool in each verse and how many are on the log? How many altogether?



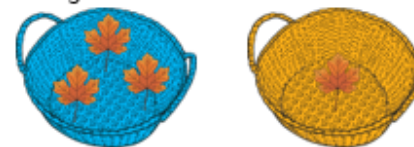
### Challenge Yourself:

- Place 5 toys on the floor. Cover some with a blanket. Can you work out how many are hidden by looking at how many are visible?

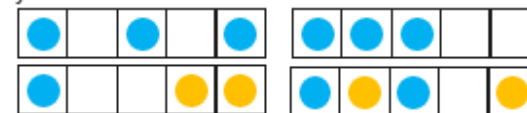
## Composition of 1-5

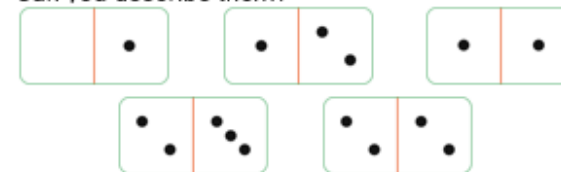
How many leaves are in the blue basket? How many are in the yellow basket? How many are there altogether?

### Challenge Yourself:


- Make balls by scrunching up paper. Take a handful. How many are there? Roll them into a goal. How many go in and how many miss?
- Sing 'Five Little Men in a Flying Saucer' using lolly stick men. You could start with 4 or 3 men too. As they fly away, they land on a planet. How many are in the flying saucer? How many are on the planet?




Stretch: mmmmountain  
Handwrite: Maisie, mountain, mountain




Bounce: a-a-a-apple  
Handwrite: Round the apple, down the leaf




Stretch: ssssnake  
Handwrite: Slither down the snake



Bounce: d-d-d-dinosaur  
Handwrite: Round his bottom, up his tall neck, down to his feet




Bounce: g-g-g-girl  
Handwrite: Round her face, down her hair and give her a curl




Bounce: o-o-o-orange  
Handwrite: All around the orange




Bounce: c-c-c-caterpillar  
Handwrite: Curl around the caterpillar




Bounce: k-k-k-kangaroo  
Handwrite: Down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg




Bounce: t-t-t-tower  
Handwrite: Down the tower, across the tower




Bounce: i-i-i-insect  
Handwrite: Down the body, dot for the head




Stretch: nnnnet  
Handwrite: Down Nobby, over his net



Bounce: p-p-p-pirate  
Handwrite: Down the plait and over the pirate's face



Bounce: u-u-u-umbrella  
Handwrite: Down and under, up to the top and draw the puddle



Bounce: b-b-b-boot  
Handwrite: Down the laces to the heel, round the toe




Stretch: fffflower  
Handwrite: Down the stem, and draw the leaves



Bounce: e-e-e-egg  
Handwrite: Lift off the top and scoop out the egg




Stretch: lllleg  
Handwrite: Down the long leg




Bounce: h-h-h-horse  
Handwrite: Down the head to the hooves and over his back




Stretch: shhhh says the horse to the hissing snake




Stretch: rrrrobot  
Handwrite: Down his back, then curl over his arm



Stretch: thhhh  
Handwrite: The princess in the tower is rescued by the horse. She say: thhthankyou




Stretch: zzzzip  
Handwrite: Zig-zag-zig



Bounce: ch-ch-choo  
The horse sneezes when the caterpillar's hairs get up his nose




Bounce: qu-qu-qu-queen  
Handwrite: Round her head, up past her earrings and down her hair




Bounce: j-j-j-jack-in-a-box  
Handwrite: Down his body curl and dot



Stretch: vvvvulture  
Handwrite: Down a wing, up a wing




Bounce: u-u-u-unicorn  
Handwrite: Down a horn up a horn and under his head



Bounce: w-w-w-worm  
Handwrite: Down, up, down, up



Bounce: x-x-x-exercise  
Handwrite: Down the arm and leg and repeat the other side
